**BARBADOS****FUEL OIL
1917-5**

An Act relating to the importation and storing of fuel oil.

[Commencement: 23rd May, 1917]

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Fuel Oil Act.

Interpretation

2. For the purposes of this Act, the expression “fuel oil” means oil residue, distillate or oil fuel derived from petroleum and not giving off inflammable vapour at a lower temperature than one hundred and fifty degrees of Fahrenheit’s thermometer.

Fuel oil may be imported on licence and subject to regulations

- 3.(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the *storage of Petroleum Act*, Cap. 172, it shall be lawful for the Minister to grant to any person a licence to import and keep fuel oil, subject to regulations made under subsection (2).

- (2) Regulations relating to the landing, storing and keeping of fuel oil may be made by the Minister, and such regulations when they have been approved by both Houses shall have the force of law.
- (3) Any person committing a breach of any of such regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of ninety-six dollars.
